Our first Time Trials are less than a month away, and we're looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible at Motorsport Ranch in Cresson on March 29th. For those of you who have considered participating, but are unsure about whether you're able to with the car and equipment that you have, here is what you need to know. If your car can pass tech inspection at an autocross, you should be able to use it for Time Trials. Also, our Time Trials program is for everyone, from novices that are completely new to motorsports, to experts who have been behind the wheel on track for decades. If you're brand new to the program, you can plan on having a coach by your side until you're ready to tackle the roadcourse on your own. Even if you don't want to compete, but still want to get some track time, our HPDE program lets you test your car's abilities without pressure of trying to put down the fastest time of the day. And finally, if you aren't ready to take your car on track yet, but still want to see what Time Trials are all about, come spectate.
